Her ongoing project celebrating heroic women nominated by their family and friends to the Ferguson Gallery at Concordia University Chicago during Women's History Month. Harris' "Beyond Boundaries: Women of Courage," a collection of oil and wax paintings, will be exhibited **Feb. 9 through March 15** at the Ferguson Art Gallery at Concordia University Chicago.

"This series of portraits celebrates women who have pushed beyond boundaries, dared to imagine and live their dreams," Harris says. "Each

painting depicts a woman that has embodied courage and nurtured those qualities in others." In addition to portraying historic icons, Harris' project features women nominated as "Women of Courage" by their relatives or friends for extraordinary acts of bravery. The project embraces multi-cultural challenges with an attempt to erase geographic boundaries, says Harris.

In Art News

A former **security guard slashed a \$1.2 million dollar painting**, "Night Sky No. 2" by Latvian artists Vija Celmins, at the Carnegie Museum of Art in Pittsburgh. It was on loan from the Art Institute of Chicago. He slashed it because he didn't like it!

The **Contemporary Art Workshop** will close its doors on April 30, 2009 after 60 years of serving Chicago-area artists. They were the oldest non-profit gallery in the country. Thank you John and Lynn Kearney for showing emerging and well-known artists for so many years and renting out affordable studio space to Chicago artists.

Shepard Fairey, a Los Angeles street artist is in hot water. His image of Barack Obama which has appeared on thousands of posters, web sites, buttons, etc. are based on an Associated Press photograph taken in April 2006 by **Mannie Garcia**. The Associated Press claims the image is a copyright infringement. But Fairey's lawyer says not so fast, because fair use protects Fairey's right to use the image. Stay tuned!

The **U.S. House of Representatives** passed their version of the Economic Recovery Package by a vote of 244 to 188 which successfully included \$50 million in supplemental grants funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)! This provision was threatened throughout the House process by opponents of the NEA who questioned its effectiveness in providing economic stimulus. Today, the NEA offered the following statement, "the arts and culture industry is a sector of the economy just like any other with workers who pay taxes, mortgages, rent and contribute in other ways to the economy; and that the National Endowment for the Arts is uniquely positioned to assist in job stimulation for that industry." Thanks to the thousands of advocates who contacted their Members of Congress and let them know the importance of maintaining funding for the NEA! Remember, knowledge is power - pay attention to what your representatives are doing and let them know what you want!

Ray Yoshida [October 3, 1930 - January 10, 2009], a well-respected professor at The School of the Art Institute, died this past January in Hawaii, where he was born. He taught fine arts and painting. He was considered a member of the *Chicago Imagists*. A retrospective of his painting and collage work , "Ray Yoshida: A Retrospective 1968 - 1998," was organized by The Contemporary Museum in Honolulu, Hawaii and traveled to the Chicago Cultural Center and the Madison Art Center. Memorial services were held in Hawaii.

Irmgard Rosenberger died on February 13, 2009. She was born in 1918 in Frankfurt, Germany. A painter and a fiber-artist, she served as president of the Jewish Arts Club, was a teacher and a philanthropist. She received her undergraduate degree from The School of the Art Institute and her Masters Degree in special education from the Chicago Teachers College. Mrs. Rosenberger taught art at several area schools, and provided art classes for autistic and handicapped children. Mrs. Rosenberger and her late husband, Ludwig, endowed the Rosenberger Chair at the University of Chicago and donated 17,000 books valued at over \$20 million to the University of Chicago.
