UPDATE

Friday, September 5, 2008, Chicago chapter members attended a preliminary meeting with Midwest Regional Chapter members to review the plans for the 2010 CAA and WCA conference scheduled to be held in our fair city of Chicago.

In attendance: Jan Nesser, Brenda Oelbaum, Margaret Parker, Dale Osterle, Judith Roth, Andrea Harris, Helene Smith Rome, Arlene Rakoncay, and Margaret Lutze.

Chicago chapter members welcomed Jan, Brenda and Margaret, members of the Midwest Women's Caucus for Art, who along with other chapters will be helping to coordinate the upcoming conference. In conjunction with the conference, exhibitions are being planned: Madron Gallery has offered space, as has ARC Gallery and Woman Made Gallery. The Lifetime Achievement Awards event will be held at the Chicago Cultural Center. A \$6,000 grant from the Friends of the Chicago Cultural Center has already been received, this will go towards event expenses. The group discussed the national WCA awards and tentatively decided that there will be two award ceremonies on the same day. The Chicago WCA will present several awards to Chicago honorees, the WCA Lifetime Achievement Awards are scheduled to follow.

A discussion followed about the future of Chicago WCA. In recent years, the Chicago chapter has begun to suffer from a lack of member participation at both the volunteer and leadership level; attracting new membership is also a concern. Actions to reinvigorate the Chicago chapter might include a letter to members alerting them that without volunteers at all levels the organization is in serious jeopardy. Asking local feminist groups to partner and collaborate with CWCA is an additional measure. Helene offered to talk to a group at Oakton Community College where she teaches and others will make inquiries at universities. It is imperative that the current CWCA members and leaders work together to energize the organization.
